



Range Rules

All Shooters are expected to know, adhere to, and help enforce range rules. If you observe a violation of the range rules, please bring it to the attention of any staff member and we will take corrective action. It is our goal to have a completely safe range for you to enjoy every visit.

1. Eye and ear protection must be worn at all times while on the range.
2. Always keep firearms unloaded and keep your fingers off the trigger until you are on the firing line ready to shoot.
3. Do not lay a firearm down on the bench unless all actions are open and ejection ports are visible. If you have a jammed or malfunctioning firearm, only then may you lay the gun down on the bench with the barrel pointed downrange. Then, ask range personnel for assistance.
4. Use only the correct ammunition for your firearm.
5. Do not hand a loaded firearm to another person.
6. Be sure your firearm is safe to operate and know how to use it safely.
7. Commands issued by the range staff must be followed immediately. When the command **CEASE FIRE** is given, **STOP SHOOTING IMMEDIATELY** and remove your finger from the trigger. Keep the gun pointed down range and wait for further instructions from range personnel.
8. When finished firing, unload and case your gun before leaving the firing lane.
9. Tracer, armor piercing, steel (case or projectile), and military surplus are not allowed on the range.
10. Safety Chamber Flags must be used in all firearms that are not on the firing line, unless holstered for conceal/open carry or are in a case.
11. All shooters under the age of 21, must be accompanied by a parent/guardian at all times on the range.
12. No one under or suspected of being under the influence of alcohol or drugs will be allowed on the range.
13. No one is permitted forward of the firing line at any time **FOR ANY REASON**. Pick up only your brass that is **BEHIND** the firing line. Never extend any part of your body beyond the firing line to retrieve brass. Do not disturb other shooters while picking up your brass, or pick up brass from another shooting point even if the brass belongs to you.
14. Cleaning of firearms is prohibited on the range.
15. Only regulation paper targets may be used on the range. Home-made targets are not allowed.
16. Use the appropriate size target placed at eye level to ensure that your shot strikes the backstop and not the floor, ceiling, or target carrier.
17. Shooting at anything other than your own target is prohibited and will subject you to removal from the range.
18. Always wash your face and hands immediately after shooting your firearm. Sinks are located in the restrooms for your use.
19. Firing a shot that results in damage to any range equipment may result in a repair fine and/or removal from the range.
20. Pregnant women, food, tobacco, and beverages are not allowed on the range due to possible exposure to lead.
21. There is no drawing from holsters.
22. Dry firing is only permitted at the firing line.
23. Do not handle a firearm or stand at the firing line when others are down range.
24. Firearm limitations: NO FULL AUTO and .44 CAL is the limit on Caliber of bullet used.
